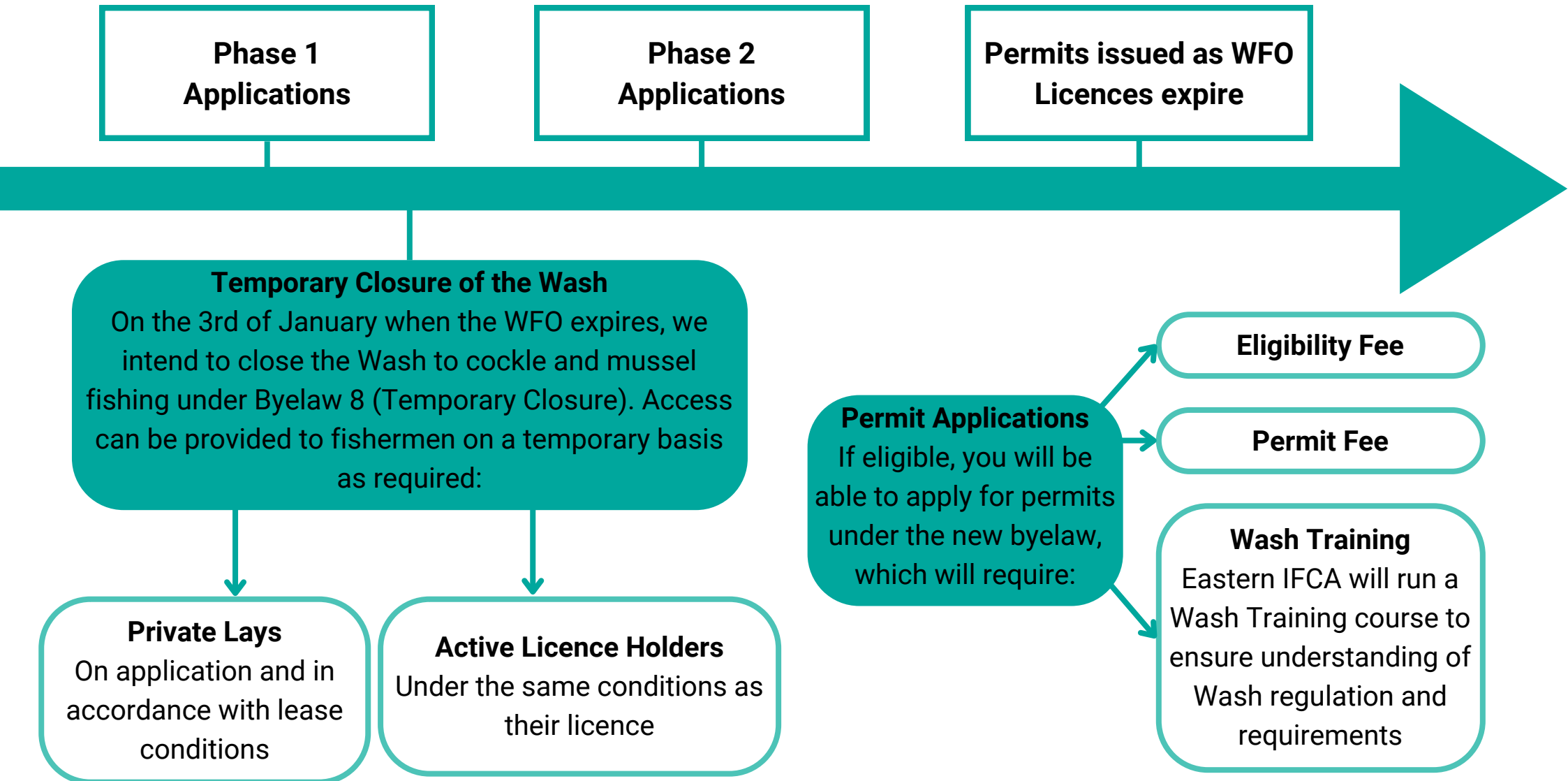


TRANSITION TIMELINE - WHAT TO EXPECT

The objective of this process is to ensure minimum disruption to the fishery. Existing active WFO Licences will remain valid for open fisheries, with the intention being to transition to the new permits as they expire.



TRANSITION

Each Wash Fishery Order Licence will be considered on application

Phase 1

To be issued a Permit under Phase one you must meet Licence Holder requirement and the activity requirement

Licence Holder requirement

▶ You held a licence between 22 February 2020 and 22 February 2022

&

▶ You were the **registered** and **beneficial** owner of the vessel named on the Licence prior to 22 February 2022

Fishing activity requirement

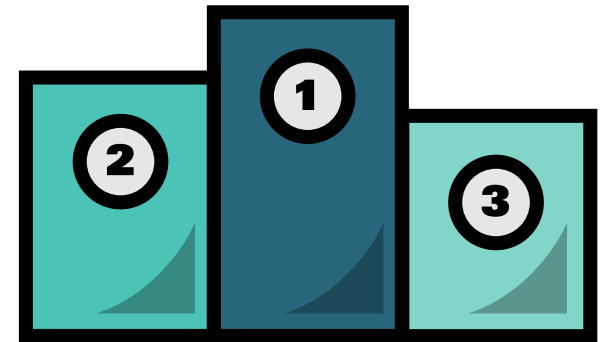
▶ the WFO licence was used to fish for at least 16 days per year for at least two separate years between 1 Jan 2015 and 1 Jan 2022

OR

▶ the person or vessel named on the WFO licence fished within Wash and North Norfolk Coast fisheries for at least 16 days per year for at least three years between 1 Jan 2010 and 1 Jan 2022

Phase 2

Any available permits will be allocated on a points-based system



- Beneficial owner of a vessel named on a WFO Licence
- Fishing activity
- Good compliance
- fewer permits = more points
